**WORLE Operatic and Dramatic Society take on one of the happiest, most romantic and richly comical musicals, when they perform The Pyjama Game at The Playhouse, Weston, from Thursday to Saturday, November 16-18.**

Filled with great songs and dance routines, it's a charming love story full of engaging and colourful characters, set in the Sleep-Tite Pyjama factory.
